#### **Principal's Report**

Welcome back to Term 3. This is generally one of the busiest terms of the year. starting with our Athletics Carnival and finishing with the Variety Concert.

#### **Athletics Carnival**

Our annual athletics carnival will be held on this Friday, 18 July. This is a school day that all students are expected to attend. Children are asked to be at school by 9.00 am to allow rolls to be marked and events to begin on time. Parents and carers are invited to join students to cheer them on. The canteen will be operating. The more helpers that are available in the canteen means that parents will be able to see their children compete in events.

Students will need to have a hat, water bottle, school jumper, and wear sensible sports shoes and either their sports uniform OR their house colours to the athletics carnival. The house colours are:

While the discus finals were due to be held today, because of rain the finals will be held next Tuesday, 22 July. Students aged 8, 9 or 10 years of age competing in the finals will do so in the morning session. Older students are expected to compete after lunch.

As shot put is an event where we would like competitive students to have three throws, finals will be held on the day of the athletics carnival. A second circle will be run for those wishing to have a throw, but who may not be in the finals.

In the event that wet weather causes us to postpone our carnival, normal lessons will be held this Friday and the carnival will be held next Monday, 21 July.

#### **Head Start 2014**

This year the Head Start project will commence in Term 3 starting Friday in Week 7, Friday 29th August 2014. It will be run each Friday with limited placements available throughout Term 3 and Term 4.

At Condobolin Public School we aim to provide a specific programme which targets early learning needs and the development of skills. This initiative is for young children who have had minimal prior to school opportunities. The limited placements will only be on offer for children intending on commencing Kindergarten in 2015 at Condobolin Public school.

The intention of this program is not for prior to school opportunities to be taken away from other providers. We work closely with our local agencies to offer experiences for all children to attend transition to Kindergarten programs and prepare them for school readiness.

Children who attend a pre- Kindergarten programme are better prepared to enter Kindergarten, both academically and socially. It helps children have a positive first experience of school which is important because it can help shape the way they think about school in the future.

In their first five years, children acquire the basic capabilities that prepare them for later success in school and life.

The Head Start programme will be held one day a week from 9.30 to 12.30 pm, starting in Week 7, Friday 29th August 2014 and will be held in the Historical building in the K-2 area. This program will run for 10 weeks and finish on Friday 14th November.

Activities planned for children are to enhance their development of skills and understanding, which support their familiarity to school life and enable them to interact productively in the classroom and school environment.

## NSW WINNERS OF THE CHC ACTIVITY CHALLENGE

In term two, Stage three students participated in the Culture Health Communities Activity Challenge. The aim was to encourage young people to be healthy by promoting an active lifestyle. Students wore pedometers while at school and kept track of their daily steps each day.

5C, 5/6R and 6R competed against 10 other schools from across NSW. At the end of the challenge, the total steps were added and 5C came out on top with 439,337 steps followed closely by 5/6R in 3<sup>rd</sup> with 426,955 steps and 6R on 412,637 steps. All three classes averaged over 10,000 steps per day. This is a fantastic result and all students are to be congratulated on their achievement.

The prize money for coming first is \$3000 for Condobolin Public School. Students would like to spend this money on improving the basketball courts at the school. There will be a presentation at an assembly this term by Lachlan Wright and Ricky Walford. Congratulations Stage Three!
