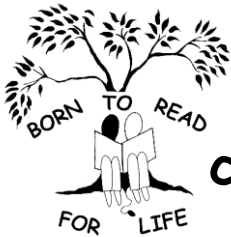

Snapshots from Year 6 – Class 6R

As part of HSIE studies, Stage 3 have been learning about cultural groups in the Asia Pacific Region. Students in Miss Richards' class were also able to enjoy creative and practical arts within this Asian theme. Masks are widely used across Asian cultures for performance and ceremonial purposes. Students recreated some colourful masks like those worn in Bali during traditional dance theatre.



Did You Know?

Balinese masks used for sacred ceremonies, must be carved from wood and can have up to 80 layers of paint!

Asian Themed Art Work

The 6R classroom boasts a colourful display of Asian influenced creative and practical art work. These include paper lanterns, fans and kites. Lanterns originated in China about 1800 years ago! They are still widely used in many Asian countries including Vietnam, China, Japan, Hong Kong, Bali and Indonesia. Students in 6R also learned paper folding techniques to create colourful paper fans to simulate the traditional handcrafted fans, usually made from thin bamboo, silk, feathers, paper, and leaves of sunflowers.
