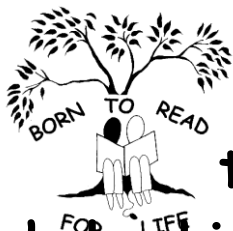
Tips for Reading with a Child

Year one participated in activities in the lead up this year's National Simultaneous Storytime. On Monday morning a small funny looking, hard green hat was hanging in our classroom. Many predictions were made to determine how the hat got into our room, without anyone seeing it! After reading the Magic Hat by Mem Fox, students decided it was probably the magic hat that turned into head gear that someone wears to protect their head when they play football or soccer.

On Tuesday another hat appeared and again the predictions and ideas from students were interesting. We read "The Singing Hat" by Tohby Riddle about a man who fell asleep under a tree and a bird landed on his head, built a nest and sang songs. Students' writing was very imaginative. On Wednesday another hat appeared which intrigued the student's curiosity even more. At 11.00am on Wednesday morning classrooms around the Nation watched this year's online story called "I Got This Hat" by Jol and Kate Temple and illustrated by Jon Foye.

Then the lightbulb moment occurred when students realised why the hats kept appearing in the classroom.

On Thursday students were invited to bring in a hat of their choice to talk about then to write a story about the hat. Many students shared funny and sentimental stories about their hats, but Preston was still thinking about what might happen when you wear a hat. His hat made him dance, so when he put the hat on, that's exactly what he did.

On Friday we finished the week with talking about the importance of wearing hats, and in particular why we wear a hat at school, the type of hat it is and what it does to help protect us from the sun. Students then wrote about their ideas.

Each student was presented with a participation certificate and feedback from the adjudicators. All students spoke confidently and were a pleasure to watch and listen to.

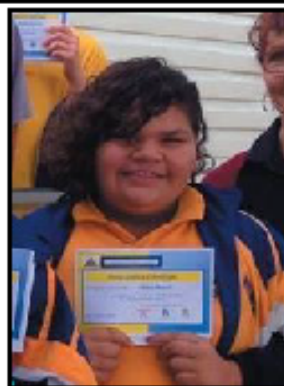

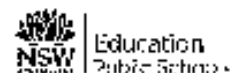
