Principal's Report

Dear Families,

LED Lights Upgrade

All the lights throughout the school have been upgraded to be LED lights as a State initiative. They have enhanced the lighting and appearances indoors. Our external lights have also been replaced.

Historical Building

The hallway flooring will be completed in the upcoming school holidays. Asset officers have visited recently to go through the planned maintenance schedule, and we are waiting to hear back what will be approved to be completed. Currently the painting of the Library building and classrooms inside and various rooms have been identified for new carpet. The process, once these items have been identified is to wait to hear what has been approved.



Establishment of a 3rd Multicategorical Class

In consultation with NSW DoE Delivery Support – student support and specialist programs and with our Director Educational Leadership, Mrs Karen Burke, CPS have been approved the establishment of a third MC class to support our students with additional needs to connect, succeed and thrive in a smaller classroom environment with individualised learning. This third class also provides our school with an Assistant Principal Special Education and a permanent SLSO for this class.

Own your own Chrome Book

For students in years 3-6, there is the opportunity to pay off a Chrome Book to own by the time a student finishes Year 6. This year the costs have been subsidised based on what year the student is in due to the shorter time frame to pay out the device compared to students from Year 3 next year. Kindergarten and Year 7 Transition has commenced

Transition has commenced for students going to CHS in 2023. This term has seen CHS staff engaging with Year 6 at both primary schools. For students who are not attending CHS in 2023 alternative arrangements are being made to support their transition into a high school setting with Miss Kontrec taking these students on the transition afternoons.

Our 2023 Kindergarten students have been visiting throughout this term with Miss Heidi. Our information session for parents is tomorrow at 10am. If families cannot make it please contact the school for a one to one meeting. A recording will also be available week 2 Term 4.

PBL Revival

PBL is undergoing a review. Our Strong, Smart and Proud values will remain the same however award processes are being evaluated. The current bronze, silver and gold awards will be replaced with an incremental rewards system that recognises achievement and effort where currently these awards are linked with our fast and frequent system. As our Good Ones are already linked to Whole School Celebration Days and end of term Celebrations days it has been decided to separate the awards. Awards will be handed out during the school day.

We will also be reviewing the current expectations under each of the values to be aligned more clearly with school practice and to develop a shared understanding throughout our school community.

2023 will see a new system in place and consultation will take place throughout Term 4 to collect feedback from students, staff and community.

This program empowered our students to have the power to stand up for one another, and give students the necessary tools and strategies to hold each other accountable for preventing bullying at our school.




