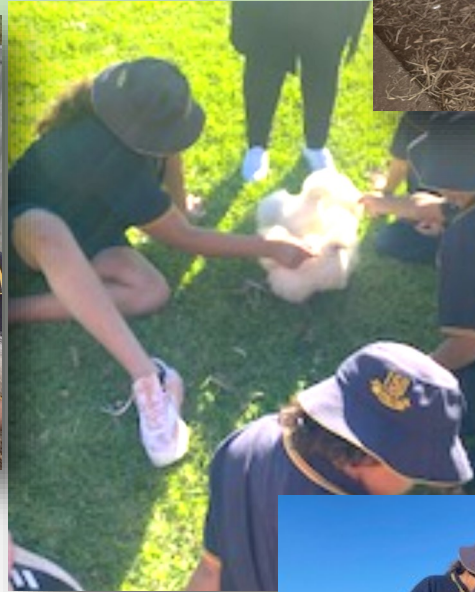
Stage 3 students have been playing a range of board games at school. Board games can help students to develop skills in communication, sharing and strategy.

Mrs Jones presented attendance awards to Stage 3 for wonderful attendance in Term 1





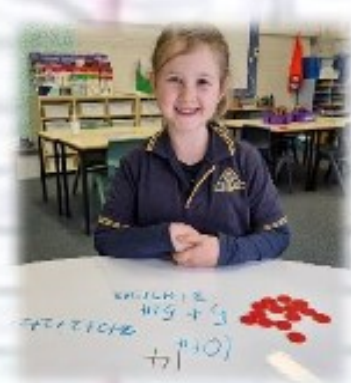
# Literacy and Numeracy:


